

# 12 Major Scales

ORDER OF FLATS: B, E, A, D, G, C, F

RULE FOR FLATS: The second to the last flat names the key. (Memorize the one-flat key.)

ORDER OF SHARPS: F, C, G, D, A, E, B

RULE FOR SHARPS: The last sharp raised a half-step names the key.

# Key Signature Review

for Beginner Band

Order of Flats: **B, E, A, D, G, C, F**

Rule for Flats: The **second to the last flat** names the key.

Order of Sharps: **F, C, G, D, A, E, B** (reverse of the order of flats)

Rule for Sharps: The **last sharp raised to the next note name** (letter in the musical alphabet) names the key.

## Most Commonly Missed Notes in the Key Signature (Key Notes):

Group 1: Flute/Trombone/Percussion: **E, A (Easy A)**

Group 2: Clarinet, Cornet: **F, B (Football)**

Group 3: Saxophones: **F, C (Fried Chicken)**
